CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPANTS II

- Pupils should be able to host partners in families
- Obligation to possess the EU Covid-19 Certificate (Green pass)
 - To check the Green Pass for participants, an information event will be organised at least one week before the mobility
 - All the collected data will be treated according to the GPDR
- Respect the various measures in place for travellers of the hosting country (<u>https://reopen.europa.eu/en/</u>)
- If needed, new selection of working groups due to the adapted Covid-19 participation criteria
- Thinking about the possibility to take out an additional risk insurance to cover cancellation fees due to the pandemic
- All the other criteria remain as fixed in the application



PRODUCT & PROJECT OUTCOMES

- Due to reschedule of activities Quality before quantity
- Participating institutions will concentrate their efforts first on the topics of the mobility they will attend in presence
- The type of products/outcomes will remain unchanged, according to the application
- Developed products/outcomes should be exchanged with all partners using digital media (especially eTwinning, project common Cloud) and should be disseminated on the dedicated platforms.

b) ACCOMODATION OF STUDENTS IN FAMILIES

- Hosting families are responsible for:
 - ✓ Taking and picking-up students from/to airport, railway station, school
 - √ Board and lodging
 - ✓ Extra-curricular activities not included in the agenda of the week (free time activities with families)



c) RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE HOSTING SCHOOLS DURING EXCHANGES WITH STUDENTS

- Hosting schools will offer a welcome dinner/lunch for the guests (32 students + 8 teachers) and a farewell buffet (families, students, teachers, etc.)
- Transportation to and from the airport/train station for teachers at all meetings

d) AGENDA/CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AT SCHOOL

- At least 6 hours of classroom immersion (Subjects and themes linked with the project topic)
- Min. 1 max. 2 workshops
- 1 conference with experts dealing with the project topic (University, Pedagogical Institute, Companies,...)
- Dissemination/Farewell event at the last night of the exchange involving teachers, pupils, parents, authorities, local press and other stakeholders dealing with the project topic
- Evaluation of the exchange
